## NEWBRIDGE JUNIOR SCHOOL PE and Sport Premium Funding 2019-20



In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding is ringfenced and schools must spend it on improving the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.

This academic year, the funding (£21100 based on 2018-19 funding) will be continued to be used to fund specialist coaches to provide high quality PE lessons for children in all areas of the PE curriculum. Staff will continue to observe these coaches (in different areas of the PE curriculum) as part of their ongoing training to develop their skills to deliver high quality PE lessons in the future.

In addition, Portsmouth School Sport Partnership will run lunchtime clubs to encourage children to take up physical activity, introducing them to a variety of sports and team games throughout the year, including football, gymnastics, basketball, netball, cricket, athletics.

We are going to replace our current wall bars as they are in need of updating. We have gymnastic coaches teaching alongside our teachers and the new equipment will enhance these lessons further.

We will continue to subsidise our after school clubs to provide a range of different sports that are accessible for everyone. This will include cricket, netball, hockey, gymnastics, dance, dodgeball, handball, archery, fencing, football, rounders, athletics and tennis.

Children will also have the opportunity to participate in inter-school and intra –school tournaments and competitions throughout the year.

All children's sporting achievements, whether in school or out of school, are celebrated in assemblies to encourage and nurture other children to participate in sport.
